YANOTCHKO: Our next Resolution on today's agenda is to authorize the issuance of 10 requests for qualifications for the professional 11 12 services that the agency will need over the year. We have the three positions that we've 13 14 needed assistance with -- you know, throughout 15 the last several years. 16 We need a financial consultant, or bookkeeper, to kind of watch the -- watch the 1.7 finances, get us prepared for the audit, or any 18 19 other audits that come our way, and keep our 2.0 finances on track and -- and running smoothly. 21 We do have a position for legal counsel to 2.2 assist with all manner of meetings and dealings 23 with -- whether it's the State or private 24 developers, redevelopers, potential redevelopers. 25 And the auditor that conducts our audit

17 each year, that's required by law. 1. And so, what this Resolution does is makes 2 sure it gets put -- you know, posted to the 3 public in connection with the local unit pay to 4 play law. 5 These -- what we're going to do is do 6 qualifications that are -- you know, fairly 7 similar to what we've done in years past. 8 Make sure they're posted on the Union City 9 website for at least ten days. And on the -- you 10 know, designated day, and I believe it's February 11 11th, open those qualifications and make the 12 selections from there. 13 So, that --14 COMMISSIONER BONITO: May I ask one --15 16 MR. YANOTCHKO: Yes? COMMISSIONER BONITO: -- question? 17 Are these positions salaried or voluntary? 18 MR. YANOTCHKO: These are -- well, they're 19 20

contract positions, is what they are.

This is contracts for either -- you know, legal counsel or well I -- or the auditor for the -- for the agency, or for the bookkeeper for the agency.

23	the Commissioners the status of Yardley and PP
24	PBG?
25	MR. YANOTCHKO: PBG.

1 MR. NG: PBG Realty. MR. YANOTCHKO: Yard -- Yard ---2 MR. NG: Maybe a little bit about what we 3 -- what we've been doing in term of the high 4 school and the closing process -- you know --5 MR. YANOTCHKO: Exactly. 6 MR. NG: -- what we've been doing with the 7 file systems. 8 MR. YANOTCHKO: Yardley's been very quiet 9 as of the last couple of months. There was some 10 pushing to get a fairly large site plan before 11 the agency and the -- and also, the Planning 12 13 Board. A very large proposal, talking about some 14 high rise buildings. 15 There's -- but at the same time, there is also a lot of information that this project is 16 17 about to be sold, or the redeveloper is trying to sell its status in certain plans for a proposal 18 19 that may be smaller in scale. Less height, maybe 20 less density on the units. 21 So, I think it's -- there hasn't been as

much pushing to get this before the Board lately because there's been a -- there's been a pending sale. And I haven't -- you know, I think that that has to -- that's going to play out over a

MR. YANOTCHKO: It might have been a little

25 shorter. They might have had some 12s and 17s 2 put in. 3 Obviously, it's probably a little more scale than what the community would -- would 4 desire. 5 So, we hesitated a bit. And then, since 6 7 then, there's been word that there's another developer who's interested in purchasing the -kind of like the role of redeveloper. Almost 9 10 like they have to put a deal together. And I 11 think it's complicated, and we're not going to know everything about it until it -- until they 12 come to us for approval. 13 14 CHAIRMAN FERNANDEZ: Right. 15 MR. YANOTCHKO: You know, we'd have to have 16 an approval if they switch redevelopers. 17 But if it's a smaller scale, the more 18 likely -- I think that will -- that will be an 19 acceptance --20 MR. NG: And we got to remember that we 21 have a --22 MR. YANOTCHKO: Yeah. MR. NG: -- the City have a Master Plan. 23

25 MR. NG: So we have to work around there

Yeah.

MR. YANOTCHKO:

you know, unifying what the -- you know, the requirements are for those kind of projects. That's a -- that's a big, big project.

CHAIRMAN FERNANDEZ: It's big. Yeah.

MR. YANOTCHKO: And the thing is, in some of these redeveloped areas, there can be -- you are allowed to build fairly high. You can buy -- you could build mid-rise, you can build even stories into the 20s, if -- if that's what the redevelopment plan says for that particular area.

So -- but there's a lot of negotiating back and forth, whether -- you know, trying to get the -- the project that's best for everybody.

So that's been quiet.
